

## Prevent Duty- Terrorism, Extremism & Radicalisation

The Prevent duty is in place as part of the UK Governments strategy against counter-terrorism within England, Scotland and Wales. Companies within the UK are required to supply adequate training to their employees that should also include radicalisation and the links between extremism and terrorism.

Individuals have a responsibility to identify those who they believe may be at risk to radicalising influences and report these to their immediate manager or support tutor.

Staff at BBE Training are trained to work with individuals and protect any vulnerable people who they believe may be at risk. They have a responsibility to carry out and inform you of the following points:

- Building resilience to extremist views
- Notice any changes in behaviour that may indicate radicalisation or vulnerability to it.
- · Refer any concerns to our company procedures.

Staff at BBE Training as have an additional duty to promote British values which include the following:

- Democracy Supplying information about democracy within the UK including the right to vote and the freedom of speech.
- The rule of law Informing people on how the UK legal system works to protect citizens and how important it is to comply with the law. They will also include the protection of individual human rights.
- Mutual respect of the faith or beliefs of others Imbedding the knowledge and importance of respecting others regardless of their religion, faith or beliefs.
